Does your branch have an event coming up this season? Are you the lucky event steward? Awesome - please read this carefully.

I am the new Kingdom Chronicler and Editor of the Crier, An Tir's official Kingdom newsletter. I want to help you make sure your events are listed in the Crier. In order to be an official event and do official things (awards, insurance coverage, official business, champions, etc) *copy must appear in the Crier*. No Crier copy means if any of that stuff happens it is NOT official until read into the record at a future, Crier listed, event.

Facebook and other social media are great places for people to find information; however, publication on social media is not recognized by SCA, Inc. as an official requirement for event notices. As such, you must publish your event notice in the Crier, along with the Kingdom Calendar, and any other online place.

Your event notice must be submitted on the 1st of the month prior to your event. For instance, if you have an event happening at any time in July, your event notice must be sent to the Office of the Chronicler by June 1st.

So, what does it take?

It is so easy - all it takes is an email to the Crier Editor. Just email me the info and I will put your event in the Crier.

That's it. Easy peasy. Email criereditor@antir.org

Remember - Nothing else will work - not the form link on the website, not submitting the DRF/EIF, not filling in info on the Kingdom calendar. Nothing will get you in the Crier except an email to me with all of the information below.

As a reminder, to be considered a full and complete event notice, you must provide the following information (feel free to simply cut & paste the below section and email criereditor@antir.org with your answers filled in)

Event Copy Requirements

- Has an EIF (Event Information Form) been sent to Calendar? This is required for copy to be published in The Crier, even Level 2 events. See Calendar Policies here: https://rb.gy/uuwelv
- Name of the event
- · Date of the event
- Open and closing hours of the event. This is the time when the populace may arrive and when they have to leave. e.g. Friday 2 pm Sunday noon
- Name of the sponsoring branch. Please identify your branch by Barony, Shire, Canton etc

- Is there a secondary or co-sponsoring branch?
- Name of the co-sponsoring branch (if applicable)?
- Who is the primary event steward and what is their contact information? SCA name and e-mail contact are the only things required. Do not include modern name or phone number
- Are there additional co-stewards?
- Please list the additional stewards and any contact information you would like published. Emails are not required but helpful.
- Gate fee for the event only. For feasts, please include any break down for fees. Class or other fees should be mentioned in the copy body only. Please use the following format: Adult non-member \$..."
- To whom should checks be made payable?
- What is the name and street address (if available) of the site?
- Would you like to provide directions to the site? NOTE: If there is no street address available, directions are required.
- What are the directions to the site? (NA if no directions are being provided). Directions are nice if GPS directions need to be more specific.
- Please enter any additional copy you would like included. (E.G. Event Description) Use this space to highlight key things for your event (tourneys, champions, merchants etc) as well as site specific things e.g. discreet, animals policy, RV rules, etc..."



If war fighting isn't your thing enter into the prize tournaments (armored and rapier) on Sunday.

Points will be awarded for war activities on Saturday, prizes will be awarded for all other activities, including but not limited to Arts and Sciences, Bardic, Magdi's Rock, Paper, Scissors tournament, and Sunday tournaments.

Come join the baron and baroness of Vulcanfeldt as they celebrate Vulcanfeldt's 20th anniversary as a barony. The weekend celebrations include war scenarios, arts and sciences competitions and displays, archery, equestrian, rapier, classes, and more. Her Excellency Fiona welcomes all to join her for the Baroness' Tea on Saturday. Contributions to the tea are always welcome.

War Scenarios: Open field battles (2), Bridge battles (2), Castle battles (2) and as time permits hill battles. Missile combat will occur in every other scenario.

Siege weapons: Several of you have asked about siege weapons... There will be siege weapons allowed at Baroness War.

EXPERIENCED CATEGORY:

Documentation Required; Object/process/technique/science, explain it, and present to judge(s).

BEGINNER: Learn how to do an A&S entry. Never won an A&S competition before? Try this out: Object, process, technique, or science. This category has documentation and presentation strongly encouraged, because we want to geek out with you on what you did/learned! Show us what you did.

"SCA COOL": A for the pure FUN of it project; sort of Medievalish, or inspired by historical stuff, but not terribly fussy about the authenticity of it; perhaps it is a useful item for SCA, though not period, but you've decorated it cleverly to disguise that. Documentation requirements are in casual mode; Tell us about the thing you made; source references are encouraged, but not required.

WORK IN PROGRESS: or one you rescued from the "Punishment Pile" and Finally Finished it! Like the SCA Cool category, you need to explain what you have going on with it, but super formal documentation is optional.

YOUTH CATEGORY: (Under the age of 18) as an object/process/technique/science; please write something to explain it and tell us all about what happened with it. Is this something that you're super excited about? Did you learn a new thing you never tried before? Tell us! We want to hear.

SOMETHING NEW: A new category, with a prize sponsored by Maestra Adrianna the Fierce; Either something you've made since last Baroness War, or something you've never entered in any A&S before.

DISPLAY ONLY: Do you have an item you do not want to present? You can do Display Only! Populace Votes for the winner.

LARGESS SUPER SIX: Half a dozen Largess Items (multiples are great). Populace Votes for the winner.

STUCK?: This is not a contest, but do you have a project that is driving you crazy? Would you like a consultation after the contests are over? Bring it and let's geek out about it! Questions? Early Irish Clothing

I asked a dear friend what she would like to read in an article. True to her Irish self, she said early Irish clothing. My question to her was, "Ok... fabric, construction, ornamentation?" She said, "Yes." Well... I found out that you can't write about any of that without writing about the culture first.

As I started to research, I found that there is a sizeable gap in the information about fabrics and styles between the iron age and Norse invasion. I'm not saying there is no information, it's just spotty. The iron age clothing is warm and practical and the process for dying is a fascinating subject all of its own. We have a great source of information and beautiful examples of this era of fashion with our own HL Una of Grimwith.

So... Fast forward to 795. This is the year that the Norse (Viking) started invasion on Ireland and by 840 they were established mostly on the north and west coasts. This is probably information most of you already know. The fascinating thing for me was to find out that for quite a while, the two cultures had separate traditions they followed in dressing themselves. They only started to blend in the mid 800's. Before that it was standard for the native Irish, men and women to wear the traditional leine, trousers, an extra tunic if it was cold and one of a variety of over the shoulder outerwear called a brat. Women did wear skirts at times, but it was usually over thick long stockings or, yes, trousers. It made perfect sense to me; it was pretty cold. The Norse men wore simple trousers, (not baggy knee length pantaloons) a linen tunic, a wool over tunic and of course, a woolen outer layer in a cloak or coat. Norse women wore long linen under dresses, woolen over dresses or woolen 'aprons', stockings and a woolen outer layer and cloak or coat. Of course, both cultures had particular shoe and hat styles.

Then as all cultures do, the styles started to blend into something more of what we recognize today for the period. But still, the native Irish kept their stylish and colorful attire in the form of the leine, trousers and brats. Fashion did blend somewhat but not totally. Until 1066 when the Irish, native and Norse adopted and were influenced by the Anglo-Norman styles. Those are the clothing styles we most recognize with the leine worn under long tunics for men belted at the waist and long dresses for women also belted. The kirtle was worn. Colors and fabrics started to divide the classes, also. But still for the Irish, the elements of the brat and leine persevered.

To make a conclusion to a subject that seems to have too many nuances to put in a short article, the best place to look at early Irish fashion is the Book of Kells. This fall down the fashion rabbit hole showed me one major thing about the Irish; no one could integrate them fully and their fashion stands proof of that.

Office Descriptions

Seneschals are the legal representative for the branch. They are responsible for the coordination of the Society activities in their branch.

Exchequers are responsible for the handling of all SCA funds within their branch.

Heralds provide heraldic services to their branches including consultations, field heraldry, town cries, and court heraldry.

Marshals are responsible for making sure that all SCA combat and similar athletic activities are conducted in a manner that is safe and enjoyable for both the participants and the spectators.

Arts and Sciences officers are the local resource for arts & sciences in the branch. They may arrange classes, workshops, promote competitions, and hold monthly gatherings.

Chroniclers act as the secretary for the branch, attending monthly meetings, publishing meeting minutes and monthly newsletters.

Chamberlain ensures that the baronial items stored in the trailer and the storage unit are available when needed for events.

Lists manage contestant scores for heavy and rapier tournaments. Currently we host tournaments at Vulcanalia and Baroness War.

Landed Barons and Baronesses

A landed Baron and/or landed Baroness are the Crown's representative within a Barony and provide the inspirational leadership for a barony. They are empowered to hold courts, grant awards which are recognized in the Kingdom's Order of Precedence; and can have Sergeants, Yeomen, Gallants, Courtiers, and Lancers. Landed Barons and Baronesses are required to report to the Crown and their Royal Highnesses one month prior to each Coronation.

"Major Officers shall be defined as those holding the offices required to function as a Barony: The Seneschal, Exchequer, Herald, Chronicler, Minister of Arts and Sciences, Master of Stables, Web Minister, and Chatelaine. While not a required position, Chief Scribe is also considered a Major Officer."
